Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was celebrated this month at ecumenical services across the chaplaincy in Bonnieux-Bas, Manosque, Marseille and Aix.

Amongst the hectic schedule of events, we were well represented at the service held at the Temple Protestante Unie in Manosque by our growing congregation. Other denominations present were Adventists, who provided live music, Roman Catholics, Mennonites and Protestants. Jamie our Chaplain led the intercessory prayers.

Members of the Luberon congregation took part in a joint service of prayer at the Eglise de Bonnieux-Bas on Friday, 20th June, which was followed by a reception hosted by Père Hubert Audibert in the Presbytery. On Sunday, 22nd January at 10.30 am we held a joint service with the Eglise Protestante Unie at their church at 4 rue Villars, Aix-en-Provence at which Jamie celebrated the Eucharist, followed by a lunch with the congregation there. That evening Roxana and he also took part in a joint service at the Eglise Saint-Férreol on the Vieux Port in Marseille.

Chaplaincy Council

The Chaplaincy Council met on 21st January. Items discussed included the following:

- We will need to adopt a new set of *statuts* in 2023 in order to comply with new laws covering *associations cultuelles*. The Diocese are working on a model set of *statuts* for use by chaplaincies.
- Initial indications are that our accounts for 2022 will show the chaplaincy more or less breaking even again, though in meeting our expenses we are reliant on a grant from the Diocese for our work with seafarers, the receipt of which is not guaranteed.
- Investigations continue into the cause of the damp problem in the church cellar.
- Ideas for fundraising in 2023 were discussed. More to follow.
- The Chaplain gave a report on the Bishops' announcement following the Church of England's *Living in Love and Faith* project.

The Chaplaincy Council meeting was held on Saturday 25th March 2023 at 2.30 pm via zoom. Below is a summary of the minutes.

The focus of the meeting was on preparing for the Annual General Meeting on 21st May at 11.45 am in All Saints Marseille and on zoom. The Annual Report was circulated and approved, as were the accounts (with grateful thanks to Peter Smith for preparing them) and an increase of 10% in the budget was also approved. The new website is progressing well. Safeguarding training continues to be a requirement for all on the Council. Copies of all AGM documents are available if anyone wishes to read them in full. All those on the Electoral Roll, which now stands at 42, are encouraged to do so and attend the AGM to have their say in the shaping of the Chaplaincy.

Chaplaincy Council

The Chaplaincy Annual General Meeting took place on the 21st May with some members attending in person at All Saints' Marseille, and others joining via zoom.

It was then followed by an Extraordinary General Meeting to review and adopt the revised *Statuts* issued for chaplaincies in the Archdeaconry France. This was in turn followed by a brief Chaplaincy meeting to nominate and elect officers to the council and adopt the Safeguarding Policy Statement. As no new people have volunteered to assist in the running of the chaplaincy the existing Chaplaincy Council was re-elected en bloc, and the Church Wardens (Peter Smith and Jane Quarmby) were also duly elected and admitted to office. We have vacancies for 5 more members on the Council and volunteers are very welcome. Amongst the positions available are those of Acting Secretary and Treasurer.

AMAM - Seamen's Club

Some time ago, Amam (the association running the Marseille Seamen's Club where several volunteers from All Saints regularly work) decided to improve the facilities offered to seafarers. We have already provided a snooker table, a table football game, a table tennis table, two guitars and a FIFA video game to use on a computer. In addition to all this, our visitors can now enjoy the new half basketball practice pitch installed next to the foyer.



Away Day

An excellent day was enjoyed in the beautiful surroundings of Jane and Garry Quarmby's home and gardens in Dauphin. The weather was kind to us, the sun shone, the gardens sparkled and all had a very convivial, relaxing time.

Lunch was provided with produce primarily grown in the garden and the opportunity was taken to get to know each other in person, having in many cases only met previously on Zoom. 

This month's newsletter is a somewhat slimmed down version, as many people are away at the moment. But as usual it contains the service times for the coming month, when we look forward to seeing you and any visitors who are with you over the summer.

Chaplaincy Council

The Chaplaincy Council Meeting took place on the 8th July 2023. By way of summary of the minutes:

Jamie informed the Council that we have now completed the application for reregistration of our association as required with the Département. Investigations were still ongoing to determine the source of the moisture causing damage to the church floor in Marseille. It was hoped that this could be resolved before winter.

A progress review on the Chaplaincy "Vision and Mission Plan 2021-24" was discussed, with the following points noted in particular:

Community – It was noted that we have made progress with our work with seafarers; hospital care and support are being provided when requested; there have been few opportunities for joint events to enable our different congregations to meet, but we have been active in maintaining our ecumenical relations; links with other faith communities are still to be developed.

Charity involvement – Help had been offered to support Ukrainian refugees at the time of their arrival in Marseille, though this was not taken up at the time.

Sustainability - There has been some progress in our move towards sustainability (e g we have now eliminated single use catering items in Marseille).

The Council members then broke up into groups to discuss and provide feedback and suggestions on how we could move forward. The results will be provided in due course.

We are pleased to announce that our new website is up and running. Thanks to Andrei Teleman and Gaston Roumieu for all their help, which has involved a large amount of work for them.

Rencontres Méditerranéennes.

Please find below an article prepared by our Curate, The Revd Roxana Teleman, regarding the forthcoming Catholic Bishops' conference culminating with the visit of Pope Francis to Marseille on 22nd and 23rd September.



September is set to be a bustling month in Marseille this year, as it plays host to a trio of significant events: the Rugby World Cup, the International Fair, and the Mediterranean Encounters (17-24 September).

Initiated by the Italian Catholic Bishops' Conference, a process of fostering cooperation among the dioceses bordering the Mediterranean was inaugurated in Bari in 2020. Following successful events in Bari (2020) and Florence (2022) in Italy, the choice of Marseille as the venue for the Mediterranean Encounters holds profound significance. Throughout history, Marseille has often stood as the doorway to the Orient. Today, for many arriving from the East or the South, it symbolizes a gateway to the West. The city is marked by a rich presence of Jewish, Armenian, North African, Levantine and sub-Saharan communities, and it hosts various Christian communities, as well as other faith groups. Marseille mirrors the complexities of the Mediterranean region: migration, poverty, conflicts, religious diversity and ecological concerns. It remains a place open to connections and dialogues.

Around 70 Catholic bishops and representatives from other churches will convene in Marseille to deliberate on the challenges confronting the Mediterranean region. The gathering will extend an invitation to young people of all faiths and denominations to participate in the bishops' discussions.

On 22nd and 23rd September, Pope Francis will come to Marseille, concluding the bishops' assembly and the meeting of young people. He will lead prayers for migrants lost at sea, alongside representatives of other denominations and faiths. The Pope's visit will serve as an

inspiring call for dialogue and peace, marking the first papal appearance in Marseille in five centuries.

Pope Francis will preside a mass on the afternoon of Saturday 23rd September, at the Stade Orange Vélodrome. This mass will provide the people of Marseille with a joyous occasion to welcome pilgrims from France and beyond, all uniting to share in this historic occasion.

Throughout the *Mediterranean Encounters*, a remarkable festival will unfold, presenting a blend of conferences, exhibitions, concerts, tours and encounters in various places in Marseille. This inclusive programme aims to raise awareness among a diverse audience about the challenges in the Mediterranean area.

Aside from the official participation of our chaplaincy in the ecumenical celebration at the church of Saint Ferréol on Friday 22nd September at 8.00 pm, there is a wide array of festival offerings to explore. The detailed programme can be accessed in English through this link:

The Chaplain writes:

As previewed in the article by our curate, The Revd Roxana Teleman, in our August newsletter, the *Rencontres Méditerranéennes* (Mediterranean Encounters) were held in Marseille from 17th to 24th September. A large number of meetings, conferences, exhibitions, concerts, tours and encounters took place across the city in an atmosphere of welcome, dialogue and celebration. Questions of faith, relations between faith traditions, challenges facing the Mediterranean region and the history which brought us to this juncture were explored, while friendships and understanding were deepened.

The culmination of the week was the visit of Pope Francis to Marseille, which was hugely well received. Pope Francis began by visiting the Basilica of Notre-Dame de la Garde, where he led prayers for migrants lost at sea at the Monuments des Disparus de la Mer, alongside representatives of other denominations and faiths.

Later that evening, Roxana and I took part in an ecumenical service held at the Eglise St-Ferréol on the Vieux Port, bringing together Christian denominations from across the city to celebrate the fortieth anniversary of Marseille's ecumenical radio station, Dialogue RCF. A rich combination of music was provided by Orthodox and Armenian choirs, before everyone joined in singing chants from the Taizé community in the presence of their Prior, Brother Alois.





On Saturday, 23rd September, Pope Francis gave the homily and pronounced the blessing at a mass for 60,000 people at the Stade Orange Vélodrome, which was presided by Monseigneur Jean-Marc Aveline, Cardinal Archbishop of Marseille. Thanks to a last-minute

gift from our colleagues in the Roman Catholic Mission de la Mer, a small group from our Marseille congregation was able to attend the mass. It was a moving climax to a unique series of events and will live long in the memory.

Remembrance

As we enter the month of November, the church turns its focus to the theme of remembrance. We begin with All Souls' Day on 2nd November when we remember loved ones we have lost, whether recently or long ago. Their names will be read during the prayers of intercession at our Patronal Festival service in Marseille on 5th November. If you would like any names added to the list, please send them to me in advance at anglican.marseille@gmail.com, or sign the list in church as you arrive.

The following Sunday, 12th November, is Remembrance Sunday, when we will join with congregations across the Church of England to remember those who died in two World Wars. Services will be held in Marseille, Oppède and Manosque at the usual times. After the service in Marseille, we will move to the Commonwealth War Graves Cemetery in Mazargues for the annual Act of Remembrance, in the presence of HM Consul Michèle Solari and representatives of the Royal Navy based in Toulon. Remembering those who gave their lives in war will be particularly poignant this year as conflicts continue in the Ukraine and Gaza.

Many people are feeling conflicted in their responses to the complexity of the situation in the Middle East. The church has traditionally held such conflicting thoughts together at this time of the year by commemorating St Martin of Tours, the soldier who left the Roman army to become a monk and who is patron saint of both soldiers and pacifists. His feast day falls on 11th November, the date the Armistice was signed.

In keeping with the theme of remembrance, we will be offering an opportunity during November to help people plan their funeral arrangements. This is something all of us should think of doing, rather than leaving family and friends to cope with the decisions at a time of stress, concerned that they may or may not be following their loved ones' wishes. If you would like to take part in the conversations (either in person or online), please let me know.
